
TO THE ARADA FAMILY

*Follow these basic instructions
on how to light your stove.*

*Pop the kettle on in readiness
for your first fire-side brew*

STEP 1


Open the fire door.



This is a very important step.


STEP 2

Add 1 or 2 firelighters or 5–10 rolled up sheets of newspaper.



STEP 3

Stack dry kindling on top of the firelighters or newspaper, use a good handful.




STEP 4

Fully open the primary and secondary air supplies.


TWO CONTROLS...

One above and one below the fire door





OR ONE CONTROL...

Below the fire door




Both below the fire door



STEP 5

Light your fire.



Matches are good for this, using flint and steel is time consuming.

STEP 6

After the paper/firelighters have caught fire, leave the door ajar about 2-3cm, or put the door on the lighting latch (on stoves where included)...




*Just a tiny bit.
Not a lot!*

*...this is to make sure
that the chimney draws well.*

STEP 7


After 5 – 10 minutes the draw from the chimney should be well established.



*At this point you can add more wood
– small pieces, not a full tree.*

STEP 8

After a further 20 – 30 mins you can add larger logs, or solid fuel. Then close the fire door.



Safety First!

*Only ever refuel onto a
bed of embers... don't open
that door to flames!*

STEP 9

If burning wood:

1. *Close the primary air control.*
2. *Control the burn rate using the secondary air control.*



If burning solid fuel:

1. *Keep the primary air control open.*
2. *Close the secondary air control **almost** completely.*

*Air controls?!
See step 4 to
remind yourself!*

STEP 10

Sit back and enjoy the flames.



You have now mastered one of the five elements.

Jargon Buster

*Knowing is
half the battle*

Firelighters:

*Flammable material
used to help start a fire.*

Newspaper:

*Something your Dad read
before the iPad was invented.*

Kindling:

Dry sticks of wood.

Unseasoned Wood:

*Wood with a moisture content
above 20%.*

Primary Air:

*Air introduced into the firebox
underneath the fuel.*

Keep this control closed when a wood
burning fire is well lit, keep it open if burning
solid fuel.

Secondary Air:

*Air introduced into the firebox
above the fuel.*

Keep this control open when burning solid
fuel or use it to adjust burn rate when
burning wood.

Chimney Draw:

*The natural draught created
by heat inside a chimney.*
